Requirements for the Bachelor of Science Degree in HIM.

Entry into the HIM program is competitive. Therefore, it is recommended that the interested student contact the department to be assigned an advisor. Students are required to complete a minimum of 60 credit hours, which include the prerequisites listed below.

Note: Some of the courses listed above may require prerequisites.

HIM will accept a combined anatomy and physiology course to fulfill both anatomy and physiology as long as it is at least five hours and includes a lab.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

1) Healthcare experience is highly recommended.

2) A resume is required with the application.

3) Three letters of reference are required. One should be from an instructor and one should be from a supervisor.

4) Average admitted GPA = 3.0.
